Reflection lessons are planned by the therapeutic team, headed up by Brett and Anni. They focus on life skills and building


self-awareness for each student. When personal progress is made, lesson content adapts to this.


A lot of visual work on the carbon cycle and make-up of atoms has featured in Science lessons.

A number of these images are also on the Facebook page in a bigger size if you're struggling to see some of this clearly.



Recent lessons helped some students improve English skills.


You use these skills everyday without even realising at times.

Really Easy Recipe



Brussel Sprouts are rather divisive over Christmas, but people seem to try at least one over the festive season!

With this recipe from Vegetarian Gastronomy, cater for up to 4 guests; including any with special dietary requirements.

You could convert them to the sprout cause and use up any green balls of goodness.

Ingredients

25 brussels sprouts
1.5 tbsp olive oil
1.5 tbsp balsamic vinegar
2-3 cloves of crushed garlic
Dried or fresh thyme
Salt

Black pepper, freshly grounded if possible

The last three ingredients are too taste, add to your liking! Don't forget a baking tray, bowl and parchment paper either.

Method

- Preheat the oven to 375 degrees.
- Cut and discard the brussels stems. Peel any yellow leaves and cut the sprouts in half lengthwise.
 - Mix all the other ingredients with the sprouts in a bowl

- Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Spread sprouts onto the baking sheet so that there is a single layer present.
- Bake for about 20-25 minutes or until the brussels are browned. Half way through, toss the sprouts so that they brown evenly.
 - Serve hot.
